## Welcome to Learn More Indiana's High School Educator Guide!

Learn More Indiana (LMI) is excited to present the educator guide for high schools for the 2024-2025 school year. We hope you and your students find these career and college-focused worksheets enjoyable. These resources are perfect to use during the Indiana College GO! campaign on **September 23-27, 2024**. But you can still encourage your students to explore post-high school opportunities throughout the year. Now is the time students begin planning for what their future might look like after graduation. Help them get on the right track with these activities! Please make copies of the following pages and share them with your students!

#### Worksheet Breakdown:

#### **Scholarship Research**

Have your students take time to look at scholarship opportunites. Encourage them to look in less common places like community organizations, local companies, or universities they are interested in.

#### **Resume Prep**

Help students begin to work on their resume! (If a student currently has a resume, encourage them to update it or have someone review it for feedback.) For those of which this is their first resume, show them examples of correct resumes for inspiration. Allow them to fill out the worksheet then begin building their resume. Talk about the importance of having a good resume and what people look for in them.

#### **University Notes**

Have students pick three universities they are interested in and write notes about the area of study they are interested in. This is a great time for them to dig deeper into their college options.

### Three Cheers for Senior Year

Have your seniors answer the questions on the worksheet! Once completed, have them talk to the class or present about their answers.

#### What's Next?

Have the students answer the questions and think about what might be their next steps after high school.

## Indiana College GO! Word Search

Encourage the students to take time to learn and study the college vocabulary words used in the word search.

#### **Interview Prep**

Partner the students up or allow them to choose a partner. Have the pairs come up with a job or scenario that they would be interviewing for. Taking turns, the students should ask each other the questions. Have the interviewer write notes about the interviewee's answer then rate their response on the sheet. (Bonus: if the students have resumes, have the partners review each other's resumes.)

#### **Networking Bingo**

Have the students talk to their classmates to fill in their bingo sheet! The students should find other indivduals who have the same answers as them. Talk about the importance of growing your network and uncovering similarities with the people in your daily life!
