Suport students in talking to a a trusted adult in their life and talking about their professional path. After students fill out the worksheet have them write a report or present about their person.

### **Create the Perfect College**

Let students create and write about their perfect college! Encourage them to find colleges that correlate with what they are looking for.

### **Networking Bingo**

Have the students talk to their classmates to fill in their bingo sheet! The students should find other indivduals who have the same answers as them. Talk about the importance of growing your network and uncovering similarities with the people in your daily life!

Have the students answer the questions and think about what might be their next steps after middle school.
